## MINUTES OF THE PLANNING, ENVIRONMENT AND TRANSPORT COMMITTEE MEETING HELD AT ROFFEY MILLENNIUM HALL, CRAWLEY ROAD, HORSHAM ON THURSDAY 27<sup>th</sup> OCTOBER 2022 AT 7.30pm

**PET/55/22      Public Forum**

There were no members of the public present.

**PET/56/22      Apologies for absence**

Members **NOTED** the apologies and reasons for absence from Cllr Mrs S Wilton.

No apologies were received from Cllr. I Wassell.

**PET/57/22      Declarations of Interest**

There were no declaration of interest declared.

**PET/58/22      Minutes**

The Minutes of the Committee Meeting held on 18<sup>th</sup> August 2022 were **AGREED** and signed by the Chairman as a true record.

**PET/59/22      Decisions Taken Under Delegated Authority**

Due to the cancellation of the Committee Meeting scheduled for 22<sup>nd</sup> September, it was necessary to agree comments via the Delegated Authority process on the applications received since the last meeting was held in July.

With regard to the WSCC application for Biffa, it was noted that this was a different application to that previously submitted which related to extended opening hours. This new application was to provide for the storage of refuse derived fuel (RDF) and compost like output (CLO) prior to export and with no specific comments received in this regard, it was decided to offer no comment on the application.

The summary of the comments submitted to HDC are attached as Appendix 1 to these minutes. Members **RATIFIED** the comments submitted to HDC.

**PET/60/22      Chairman's Announcements**

- i. Details of Compliance cases in the Parish notified by HDC had been circulated to Members via email.

ii. A workshop on Climate Change was organised by HDC on Wednesday 28<sup>th</sup> September. As Members had been notified by email, Cllr. Turner, as Chairman of the Committee, attended the workshop, accompanied by Cllr. Gough. A follow up session was held in person on 20<sup>th</sup> October, and Cllr. Gough attended on behalf of NHPC. Cllr. Gough read out the following report:

*“The greatest threat to our planet is the belief that someone else will save it”(Robert Swan, Polar explorer).*

*There has been most climate damage in the last 25 years and it is likely to accelerate. The climate is now hotter than any other time in history.*

*Global impacts: food insecurity, fires, flooding, drought etc.*

### **UK impacts : Extremes of weather**

- *Infrastructure damage due to heavier rainfall*
- *Flooding: loss of agricultural land (disruption in food chain – seasonal confusion affects crops which leads to price rises and hoarding)*
- *Greater heat: Impacts on health especially babies and the elderly and mental health – anxiety, resignation and depression*

### **Horsham District Council Targets for 2030**

1. *Aspire to reach carbon neutrality by 2030 from petrol, diesel, gas and electricity*
2. *Council's indirect emissions to be carbon neutral by 2050*

### **Their Vision**

- *Accessibility on foot, cycles and buses*
- *Clean water and air*
- *Healthy children*

### **Their Action**

- *Currently producing a low carbon plan for Horsham District for Parish and Neighbourhood councils, Residents, Businesses, community and voluntary groups and schools.*

### **What is needed**

- *Sustainable transport and energy e.g reliable bus services and community transport*
- *Walking and cycling infrastructure plan*
- *Provision of electric charge points*
- *Solar panels for residents and businesses*
- *Affordable energy help to all residents*
- *Make homes more energy efficient*
- *Reduce waste and consumption (especially water – Pulborough Brooks has shrunk)*
- *Protect biodiversity*
- *Register of older people at risk of food poverty and warmth*
- *Encourage farmers to diversify and grow more than one crop a year in their fields. Empty fields create shortage of insects and birds.*

## **Action Possibilities for North Horsham**

### **Major expense and commitment**

1. Retro fitting – replacing boiler with a heat pump
2. Solar panels on PC roofs
3. Bio diversity survey and campaign
4. Purchase CO2 measurement tool and mount it on outside of PC building
5. Eco event with help from local scouts, girl guides, youth groups

### **Other more affordable suggestions**

1. Community workshops e.g removing draughts from homes, repairing and recycling items
2. Running a local environment competition (e.g. for local schools)
3. Submit articles in local magazine
4. Information on Parish website and facebook pages
5. Appoint a climate rep on the council
6. Ensure walking and cycling routes on new housing and commercial developments are safe, direct and attractive
7. Ensure, where possible, that new planning applications meet energy efficient standards e.g insulation

Members suggested that it might be beneficial to feature climate change at the next Annual Meeting of Electors of the Parish. The Deputy Clerk will advise the Clerk accordingly.

It was also suggested that a 'Climate Change Working Group' be set up to look at actions that the Parish Council can carry out and then be recommended to Council. The Deputy Clerk will request that this item is added to the next available Council meeting.

- iii. A report has been compiled by a local resident on access problems encountered by users of mobility scooters in Horsham Town and a copy is available from the Parish Office.
- iv. An email was received from a resident as follows:

*I have great concerns over the safety of pedestrians along Lemmington Way, Horsham, during school drop-off/pick-up times. Unfortunately, despite Bohunt school sending out several emails asking them not to, parents are continuing to choose to drop-off/pick-up their children close to bridge by Lemmington Way.*

*Parents are parking their cars very close to the roundabout. This is extremely unsafe for both children and adults attending the school, and other pedestrians. Yesterday afternoon, parents were also parking on the pavement!*

*My son who attends Bohunt school, had to push his bike home, along the pavement because he felt too unsafe to be riding on the road due to all the cars coming and going. However, he could also not get past the cars on the pavement with his bike!*

*It is a ridiculous situation which is extremely unsafe. It is only a matter of time before there is a serious accident.*

*The problem could easily be resolved by the council painting double-yellow lines from the roundabout to further along Lemmington Way.*

*Please can someone do something about this, I am sure we are not the only parents concerned for the safety of our child and others.*

As this matter is a WSCC Highways issue, the email has already been forwarded to Cllr. Baldwin.

- v. The Environment Agency has provided an update (via SLCC) on the outcome of last year's consultation on amendments to the Environmental Permitting

Regulations 2016 (England & Wales) as applied to groundwater and surface water in cemeteries. Amendments to the Regulations are still working their way through the parliamentary process but, at a recent virtual meeting, it was confirmed that for most local councils with existing burial grounds and requiring no ongoing mitigation measures to protect the environment, there'll be no change and permits won't be needed. However, when applying for planning permission for a cemetery extension or for a new site, applicants will be alerted about whether to also apply for a permit. Useful government guidance on requirements for new sites and extensions that came into effect is available on the .Gov.UK website together with information about undertaking risk assessments.

- vi. The Parish Council has been included in communications with WSCC regarding the Community Highways Scheme in Pondtail Road and the new priority system under the railway bridge. There has been some concern about the lack of signage of the new layout, but WSCC have advised that the contractor will be erecting these shortly. With regard to permanent warning signs, WSCC have stated that they are restricted by the signs that are prescribed by the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions. There are road narrows signs on both approaches, effectively warning of an upcoming hazard, but the TSRGD does not recommend a sign that specifically warns the motorist of an upcoming priority system.
- vii. In a recent update from WSCC on Highways and Planning issues, the following were reported :

**Changes to Community Traffic Regulation Orders (TROs)** - In West Sussex, requests for TROs are received from communities to deal with matters such as speed limits, parking controls and moving offences. For example, width restrictions and Heavy Goods Vehicles (HGV) restrictions. These requests are known as Community TROs. Some examples would include, use of double yellow lines for junction protection, reduction in speed limits along short stretches of highway, or the introduction of HGV restrictions. Following a review of how the County Council processes and delivers applications for Community TROs, applications will be considered as they are submitted rather than once a year. This will allow more TROs to be delivered, more quickly - typically within 7 to 11 months, previously it could take well up to two and a half years.

**Changes to the process of reporting road and pavement issues - From late November 2022 WSCC will be changing the process for reporting road and pavement issues, replacing it with mobile device friendly eforms.** The benefit of the new process is that reports will be automatically uploaded into their Highways Case Management System and assigned to the right team. Customers who would normally make reports using Love West Sussex will receive a pop-up message signposting them to the correct eform for the issue being reported.

**Signs and Lines Update** - Additional funding allocated to Highway Operations for 2022/23 has enabled more sign cleaning, bollard cleaning and localised vegetation cut back (so that existing sign faces are visible). This is a Countywide project and the sites have been identified through the Local Highway Teams. All signs and highways furniture on each identified route will be cleaned and vegetation cleared. The work has been planned in batches and in the first seven-week batch, approximately 500 signs have been cleaned and made more visible. The next batch of sign cleaning work will take place in November.

HDC advised that an Appeal has been lodged in relation to DC/22/0074 - 6 Yarrow Close, Horsham, for the erection of fence to enclose land north of no. 6 and enlarge the residential curtilage. This application was considered under the Parish Council's Scheme of Delegation and ratified at the Committee at the meeting on 28th April 2022. The comment submitted was "*Objection; The enclosure of the land damages the open plan appearance of the development and creates an ungainly fence line between 6, Yarrow Close and 2, Campion Road.*"

Members **NOTED** the Planning Appeal.

<p><b>NHPC comments from 23/12/2021:</b></p> <p>Whilst there is no change to the previously submitted comment of No Objection to this application, the following comments have been made with specific regard to the issue of noise and the published Operational Noise Impact Statement:-</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Whilst residents of nearby houses and flats are currently impacted by traffic using Crawley Road, the use of a retail unit would add considerably to the noise levels i.e. slamming of car doors, cars entering and reversing, wheeled shopping trolleys, loud conversations, shop doors opening and closing, goods being delivered and waste removal. Although efforts have been taken to record Db levels at various times of the day and night, there is concern that the closing/slamming of car doors in the car park at night could be more irritating/disturbing to residents living close by.</li> <li>Agree with the Environmental Health suggested revised trading hours to reduce the impact of noise (8.00 to 22.00 Monday to Sunday and revised delivery times (8.00 to 22.00 Monday to Friday and 8.00 to 12.00 on Saturday)</li> <li>Concern regarding the considerable noise during demolition, clearance and construction of the site and therefore agree with the Environmental Health suggestion that this should only take place between 8.00 to 18.00 Monday to Friday and 8.00 -12.00 Saturday) although I think that 8.00 to 16.30 Monday to Friday may be preferable.</li> </ul> <p><b>Parish Council Comments 21.09.22</b></p> <p>Whilst there is no change to the previously submitted comment of No Objection, concerns about traffic management and noise nuisance as detailed above remain.</p>
